**They had a splendid opportunity of visiting the marvellous landmark of Kanchipuram, Uthiramerur. Children were eager to know that Uthiramerur was ruled by the Pallavas, Cholas, Pandyas, Sambuvaraya, Vijayanagara Rayas and Nayaks. It was an amazing experience to visit Sundara Varadaraja temple which had a lot of inscriptions.**

**As per the inscriptions in the temple, the Pallava king Nandivarman II (Pallavamalla) 730-795 CE established the village around 750 CE. The temple inscriptions of Uthiramerur are notable for their historical descriptions of the rural self-governance. They saw inscriptions on the stones. Mrs. Uma explained on the history of temple and governance system. Mrs. Uma also briefly narrated the Kudavolai system used to elect their leaders during elections.**

**The students could relate how they are different from the present day governance. This triggered the curiosity to know more. Over all it was an awesome experience as it included learning beyond the classroom walls with amazing schoolmates.**

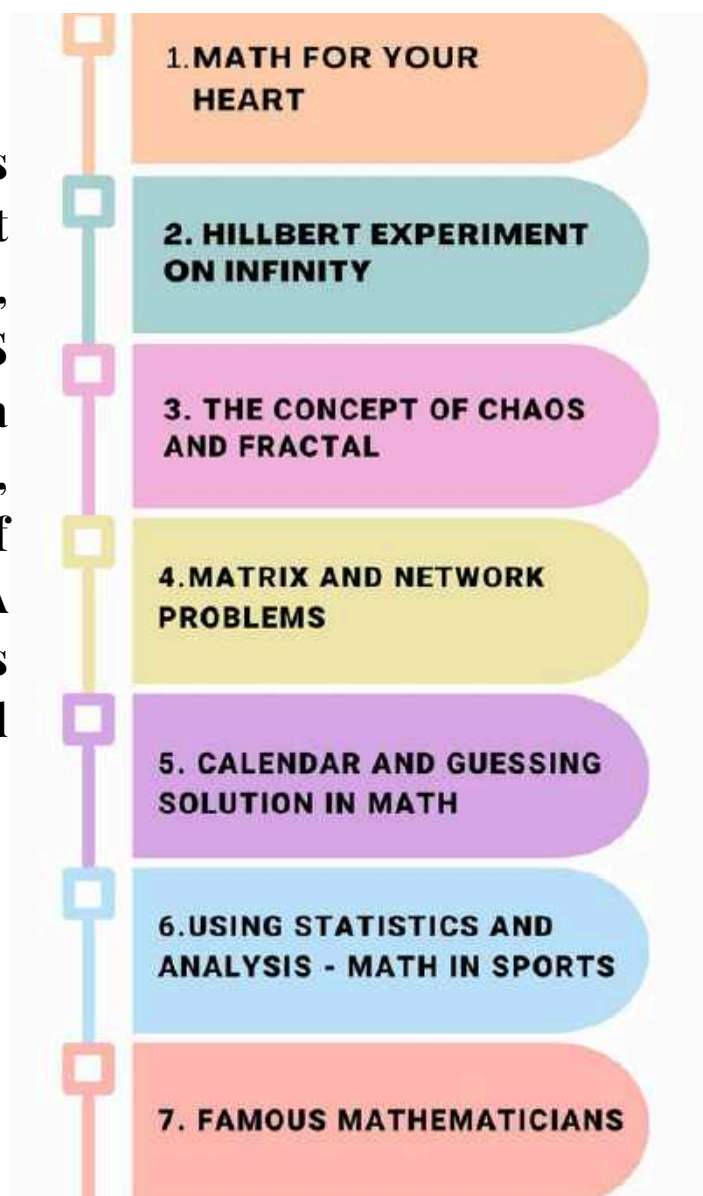
# MATH DEPARTMENT ACTIVITY

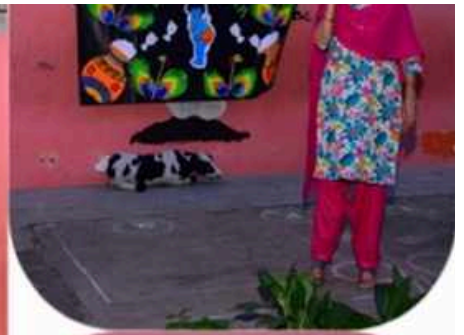

# Calculating Our Mass and Age on Other Planets

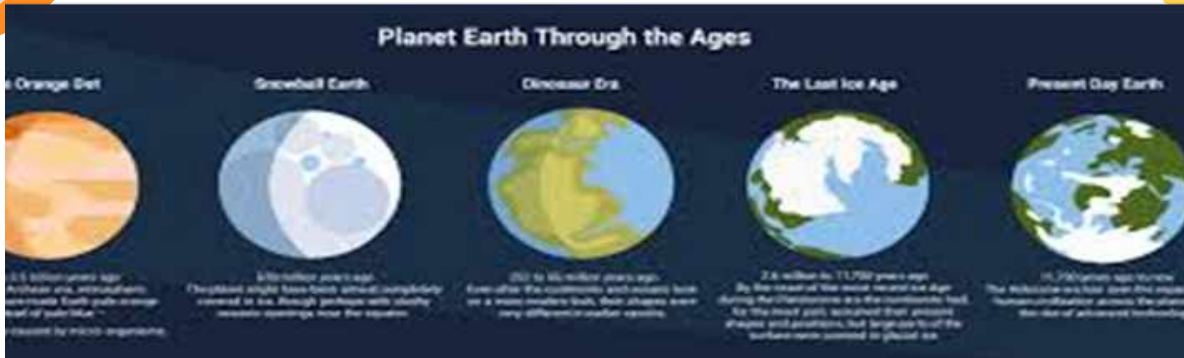

**The following were the points discussed during the session:**





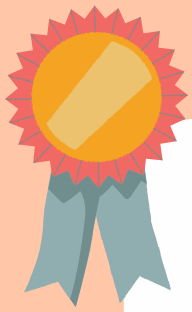

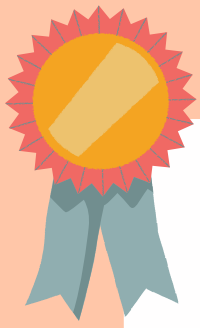
**The collaborative activity yielded several positive learning outcomes:**

# TI WIZ QUIZ

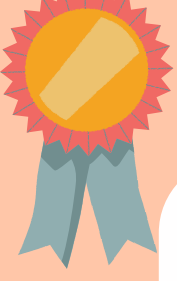

**An awareness on Child Safety program was conducted for the students of classes VIII and X on 4/1/24.**

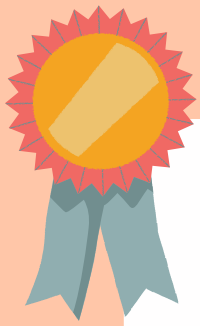

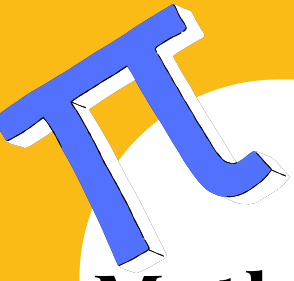


# ZEE Mind Wars

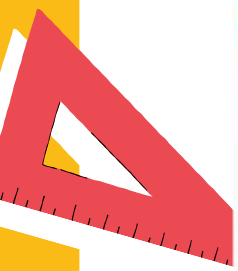
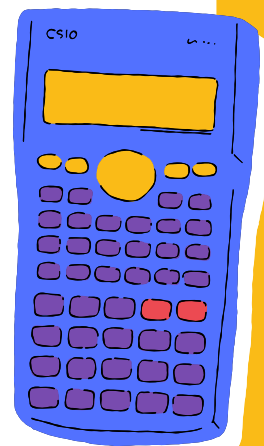

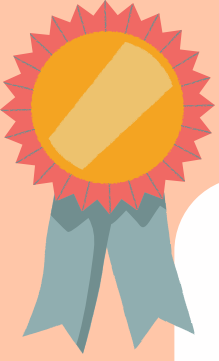


# Math Poster Presentation Activity – February 2024

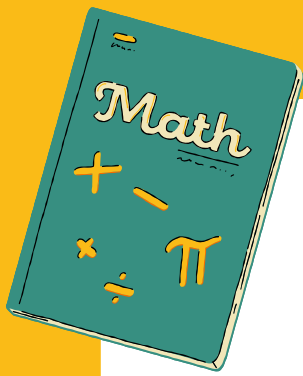

It was a "Farewell, but not goodbye. ..."



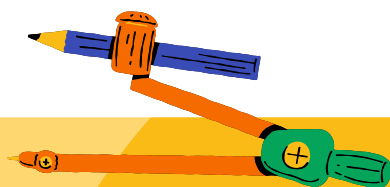




# Explore Math-2024
