


ASTRONOMY CLUB





The following were the contributions made by our students: Rs.25,000 cash, Milk powder 31.5 kg, Semolina 219.5 kg, Wheat flour 21 kg, salt 2kg Maggi 21 packets, Biscuits 1039 packets, Sanitary napkins 35 no's, Water bottles 48 no's, Rusk 75 packets, other items include rice, dhal, sugar, jam, bread, soap, toothbrush and paste, shampoo, hair oil. This was contributed to the victims of the Wayanad landslide through the Jatayu Charitable Trust.

Creativity takes courage -Henry Matisse





YOUTH PARLIAMENT





KIDS TO KIDS CONTRIBUTION








FIELD TRIP TO MAHABALIPURAM


Every block of stone has a statue inside it, and it is the task of the sculptor to discover it.


